RE: Labour Mobility for Landscape Architects


Thank you for attending our Board meeting on July 25, 2000 to answer our concerns on the labour mobility initiative.

Please accept this letter, on behalf of the British Columbia Society of Landscape Architects (BCSLA), as confirmation that the BCSLA and the Ontario Association of Landscape Architects (OALA) are both members of the Council of Landscape Architecture Registration Boards (CLARB), an international non-profit corporation that administers the Landscape Architecture Registration examinations (LARE) on behalf of its member boards.

As such, we have an agreement to accept each other's registered members as reciprocity candidates. For the Board of Examiners to recommend reciprocity candidates to the BCSLA for registration in British Columbia, the candidates must only demonstrate a familiarity with local legislation to prove a minimum level of competence.

It is our hope that other provinces will also choose to register their landscape architects using this process so that we can accept their credentials with the same ease and certainty.
