Course Format

Delivery: OnlineLevel: Beginner

Commitment: 12 weeks of study, 2—3 hours/week

This course consists of twelve modules, each with a series of:

- video lectures,
- a set of course notes and <u>course glossary</u>,
- and required and recommended readings.

They get progressively more difficult, Lesson 3 focuses on Treaties. The quizzes require you to study the material carefully, very much like taking a history course. For a busy LA working full time, this is a big commitment. While the lessons are very interesting, they are not directly applicable to Landscape Architecture.

KAIROS Blanket Exercise

Developed in collaboration with Indigenous Elders, Knowledge Keepers and educators, the KAIROS Blanket Exercise (KBE) is an interactive and experiential teaching tool that explores the historic and contemporary relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in the land we now know as Canada.

Designed for groups of 20 to 46 participants, must be booked in advance.

The 90-minute feature documentary film *Picking Up the Pieces: The Making of the Witness Blanket* weaves those stories with Carey Newman's personal journey, examining how art can open our hearts to the pain of truth and the beauty of resilience.
