ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, UBC LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

Drawing is a skill, craft, conversation, research method, idea development and documentation which should be practiced by all designers from beginners to professionals. Hand drawing in the traditional sense has been expanded to pixel computation with a stylus, but the physical movement of the hand is still required as in traditional drawing and the digital tools are so refined that digital 'hand' drawing may have a comeback. This presentation describes future hand drawing possibilities in education and practice.

Daniel Roehr is a licensed landscape architect in BC and Berlin. He is currently working on his second book "Seeing Environment: Interacting with the Landscape - A Guide for Designers" (exp. 2021).
