## The LACF and the CSLA Announce ''CONVERSATIONS'' about *Landscape Architecture in Canada -A cross Canada speaking tour with Ron Williams*

Ottawa – DATE - Ron Williams' long awaited book *Landscape Architecture in Canada* is now available in both English and French. To promote the book and engage landscape architects and the public in conversations about landscape architecture, LACF and CSLA are currently collaborating on a cross-Canada speaking tour aptly entitled 'CONVERSATIONS'. The narrative of these talks will highlight the role landscape architects have played in shaping the Canada we live in today and bring the history of the profession to life in a way that will appeal to a broad audience.

The official launch of Ron Williams' book was met with an enthusiastic reception at the annual CSLA Congress in Ottawa on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2014. A second celebration and debut CONVERSATION was held June 5<sup>th</sup> at Montreal's Canadian Centre for Architecture in front of a full house. Landscape architects Vincent Asselin, FCSLA and Peter Jacobs, FCSLA led the CONVERSATION by asking the author about the process of researching the book and bringing it to fruition. A multi-disciplinary crowd then eagerly joined the CONVERSATION with many questions of their own. Everyone agrees that this long awaited and beautifully laid out volume promises an informative and enticing read.
